

Christmas Pageant

NARRATOR: Welcome to Grace Church's Christmas pageant! The first part of our service this evening will be acted out by the Sunday School with help from some enthusiastic parents. You are invited to sing along with the hymns. Please sing along with the glorious Christmas hymns as Gerry plays the music. The words are in your bulletin.

NARRATOR: God chose a young girl named Mary, who lived in the town of Nazareth in Galilee to be the mother of His Son. Mary was engaged to a

man named Joseph of the house of David. God sent His angel, Gabriel, to tell Mary that she has been chosen.

GABRIEL: "Do not be afraid, Mary, for you have found favor with God. And behold, you will give birth to a child, a son, and you shall call His name Jesus . . . and of His Kingdom there will be no end."

MARY: "Behold, I am the handmaid of the Lord, let it be to me according to your word.

NARRATOR: At that time Emperor Augustus ordered a census to be taken throughout the Roman Empire. Everyone then went to register himself, each to his own home town. Joseph went from the town of Nazareth in Galilee to the town of Bethlehem in Judea. He went to register with Mary, who was going to marry him. Joseph was born in Bethlehem so he had to travel all the way from Nazareth. It was a long journey; Mary rode on a donkey because she was going to have a baby but Joseph had to walk. While they were in Bethlehem, the time came for her to have her baby.

Joseph and Mary were so tired from their long journey and had nowhere to stay. At last, a kindly Inn-keeper took pity on them and let them stay in the cave behind her inn where the animals were stabled. Mary gave birth that night and she had a baby boy. Joseph and Mary gave him the name Jesus but they didn't have a crib for him, so they wrapped him up in strips of cloth and laid him in the soft hay in the animals' manger.

Hymn: Away in a Manger

Away in a manger, no crib for his bed, the little Lord Jesus laid down his sweet head. The stars in the bright sky looked down where he lay, the little Lord Jesus asleep on the hay.

The cattle are lowing, the baby awakes, but little Lord Jesus no crying he makes. I love thee, Lord Jesus! Look down from the sky, and stay by my side until morning is nigh.

Be near me, Lord Jesus; I ask thee to stay close by me for ever, and love me I pray. Bless all the dear children in thy tender care, and fit us for heaven to live with thee there.

NARRATOR: An angel of the Lord appeared to them, and the glory of the Lord shone over them. They were terribly afraid; but then the angel spoke:

ANGELS: "Don't be afraid, I am here with good news for you, which will bring great joy to all the people. This very day, in David's town, your Savior was born - Christ the Lord! And this is what will prove it to you: you will find a baby wrapped in cloths and lying in a manger."

NARRATOR: Suddenly a great army of heaven's angels appeared with the angel, singing praises to God:

Hark! the herald angels sing glory to the newborn King! Peace on earth and mercy mild, God and sinners reconciled! Joyful, all ye nations, rise, join the triumph of the skies; with the angelic host proclaim Christ is born in Bethlehem! Hark! the herald angels sing glory to the newborn King!

Christ, by highest heaven adored; Christ, the everlasting Lord; late in time behold him come, offspring of the Virgin's womb. Veiled in flesh the Godhead see; hail the incarnate Deity. Pleased as man with man to dwell; Jesus, our Emmanuel! Hark! the herald angels sing glory to the newborn King!

NARRATOR: There were some shepherds in that part of the country who were spending the night in the fields, taking care of their flocks. The shepherds said to one another,

SHEPHERD: Let us go to Bethlehem and see this thing that has happened, which the Lord as told us.

NARRATOR: So they hurried off and found Mary and Joseph and the baby lying in the manger.

Hymn: What Child is This?

What child is this, who, laid to rest, on Mary's lap is sleeping? Whom angels greet with anthems sweet, while shepherds watch are keeping?

This, this is Christ the King, whom shepherds guard and angels sing; haste, haste to bring him laud, the babe, the son of Mary.

Why lies he in such mean estate where ox and ass are feeding? Good Christian, fear: for sinners here the silent Word is pleading.

NARRATOR: Some men who studied the stars came from the East to Jerusalem and asked:

BALTHAZAR: Born a King on Bethlehem's plain, gold I bring to crown him again, King for ever, ceasing never over us all to Reign. (Chorus by all)

MELCHIOR: Frankincense to offer have I: incense owns a Deity nigh; prayer and praising, gladly raising, worship him, God Most High. **Chorus by all)**

GASPAR: Myrrh is mine; its bitter perfume breathes a life of gathering gloom; sorrowing, sighing, bleeding, dying, sealed in the stone-cold tomb. **(Chorus by all)**

Sung by all: Glorious now behold him arise, King and God and Sacrifice; heaven sings alleluia: alleluia the earth replies.

O star of wonder, star of night, star with royal beauty bright; westward leading, still proceeding, guide us to thy perfect light!

NARRATOR: They saw the child with his Mother Mary, and knelt down and worshipped Him. They brought out their gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh, and presented them to Him. The Magi said goodbye but they didn't go back to Jerusalem; they didn't trust King Herod. When they had seen the baby, they spread the word concerning what had been told them about this child, and all who heard it were amazed at what they said to them. But Mary treasured all these things and pondered them in her heart. Today we can come to the Christ Child just as truly as the shepherds and the Wise Men did. God will give us that joyous fellowship with Him - lost so long ago.

Hymn: O Little Town of Bethlehem

O little town of Bethlehem, how still we see thee lie! Above thy deep and dreamless sleep the silent stars go by; yet in thy dark streets shineth the everlasting Light; the hopes and fears of all the years are met in thee tonight.

For Christ is born of Mary; and gathered all above, while mortals sleep, the angels keep their watch of wondering love.

O morning stars, together proclaim the holy birth!

and praises sing to God the King, and peace to men on earth.

Where children pure and happy pray to the blessèd Child, where misery cries out to thee, Son of the mother mild; where charity stands watching and faith holds wide the door, the dark night wakes, the glory breaks, and Christmas comes once more.

NARRATOR: This is the Christmas gift that God gives to you and to me and to everyone on earth. This is where our Christmas story ends, but it is not the end of the story. We know that Jesus' story continues to touch people of all backgrounds, just as it touched the people in Bethlehem and the Magi from far away. Jesus' story is a gift, not of gold nor wrapped in paper and bows, but of Light and life. The light that shone for the Magi shines for us still, guiding us towards Jesus, towards hope, towards new life. The famous **Radio City Music Hall Christmas Nativity** used to end with these words: "nineteen centuries have come and gone and today Jesus is still the central figure of the human race. All the armies that have ever marched; all the navies that have ever sailed; all the parliaments that have ever sat; and all the kings that ever reigned put together have not affected the life of mankind on earth as powerfully as that one solitary life."

The Nicene Creed (please stand)



Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy Name, thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven.


Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us.




Celebrant and People
